- **Drivers of Presidential votes in Ghanaian Elections**

This project focuses on understanding the drivers of presidential election's outcomes in Ghana, exploring the interplay of political, socio-economic, and cultural factors. It examines the role of ethnicity, party loyalty, campaign strategies economic conditions, governance performance, and demographic shifts in shaping voter behavior. It configures how institutional frameworks, such as electoral rules

and the independence of the Electoral Commission influence electoral outcomes. The Mixed Method (combining quantitative and qualitative methods) to nuance these imperative thereby broadening our understanding of the electoral politics.

- **Identity Politics and Parliamentary Elections**

Ethnic balances and dynamics in electoral fortunes in Ghanaian democracy. Historically, Accra symbolises a region where ethnic tolerance of parliamentary candidates is highly revered. However with the development of democratic tenets, other regions are embracing the idea of ethnic tolerance while other electoral areas and constituencies still consider it abhorrent to native interest and development. This project investigates the role of ethnic balances and dynamics in shaping electoral fortunes within Ghana's democratic framework. It explores how ethnic identities influence political party support and voter alignment, particularly in relation to the perceived inclusivity or exclusivity of party leadership and policies. The project examines the strategies political parties use to manage ethnic diversity, foster national cohesion, and secure cross-ethnic alliances while navigating the potential risks of ethnic polarisation. Through case studies, data analysis, and fieldwork, the project aims to provide insights into how ethnicity intersects with democracy in Ghana, contributing to the broader discourse on ethnicity and electoral politics in Africa.
